		<p><u>Social Distancing</u> Social Distancing -Reducing the number of persons in any area to comply with the 2-metre (6.5 foot) gap recommended by the Public Health Agency</p> <p>To enable the shower block and toilets to be used a maximum of two members only will be allowed into the building at any one time. To control numbers signage will be implemented at the entrance door indicating the number using the facility at that time.</p> <p><u>Shower Block</u></p> <p>Due to the limited space with this facility and the need for social distancing only <u>TWO</u> members will be allowed at any one time. It will be the responsibility of the member to ensure the appropriate cleaning is completed after <u>EACH use.</u></p> <p><u>Toilets</u></p>				<p>Rigorous checks will be carried out by Committee Officers to ensure that the necessary procedures are being followed.</p> <p>Members to be frequently reminded of the importance of social distancing. Committee Officers to undertake regular checks to ensure this is adhered to.</p> <p>Keypoint 1 Members whose caravan has working showers and/or a toilet will be actively encouraged to use their own facilities. This will lessen the need for deep cleaning.</p> <p>Keypoint 2 Do we lockdown these facilities and inforce members to use their own facilities?</p>
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		<p>Due to the limited space with this facility and the need for social distancing only TWO members will be allowed at any one time. It will be the responsibility of each member to ensure the appropriate cleaning is completed after use. Cleaning should include but not limited to the toilet seat and flush lever, all door handles and any other fitting or fixture that may have come into contact.</p> <p><u>Wearing of Gloves</u> Where Risk Assessment identifies wearing of gloves as a requirement, an adequate supply of these will be provided. Members will be instructed on how to remove gloves carefully to reduce contamination and how to dispose of them safely.</p> <p><u>Symptoms of Covid-19</u> If anyone becomes unwell with a new continuous cough or a high temperature whilst at the club they will be sent home and advised to follow the stay at home guidance. Hazard Identification

When undertaking a risk assessment consider the following hazards (this list is not exhaustive and other hazards may be present)

Acid	Falling / flying objects	Other people
Adverse weather	Falls from height	Physiological Capabilities (Human Factors)

Severity

1	Minor injury no lost time
2	Minor Lost time Injury under 7 days
3	Serious lost time injury over 7 days
4	Major Injury (Specified Major under RIDDOR)
5	Fatality
